Explore time signatures, learning to feel the difference between three and four beats in a bar. Listen to a range of music, exploring folk traditions such as Morris and Basque Dance Learn to play rhythms expressively, selecting suitable timbre and dynamics Develop ensemble skills Learn how composers create interesting textures by combining layers of musical sound Perform songs and accompany them with polyrhythmic texture Represent multilayered textures using informal notation such as rhythm grids. | Music and Words Explore songs and musical activities to develop understanding of the inter-related dimensions of music and musical vocabulary Explore creative listening activities, learning to represent expressive features in music in a graphic score Improvise rhythmic and melodic patterns to a four- beat pulse and perform with a sense of style Learn how improvisations has been used throughout musical history Learn about music styles such as jazz and influential musicians such as Louis Armstrong.
