Dead	No longer alive.
Organism	An individual living thing such as a plant or animal.
Habitat	A place that an animal or plants lives. It provides the animal or plant with food, water and shelter.
Micro-habitat	a small part of the environment that supports a habitat, such as a fallen log in a forest.
Environment	The area in which something exists or lives.
Nutrition	The process of eating and using the nutrients in food for living and growing.
Movement	Being able to move.
Prey	Animals that are hunted for food by other animals.
Predator	Animals that eat other animals.
Reproduce	Creation of new plants (seeds) or animals.
Growth	The process of increasing in size.

Food chains

All living things need food to create energy.
This process is called nutrition.

Plants - do this through photosynthesis using water, carbon dioxide and light.

Animals - need to eat food (other plants and animals) in order to get energy.

Therefore, living things depend upon one another to live.
