


<b>Water cycle</b>	The way that water moves between being water vapour to liquid water and then back to water vapour.	<b>River</b>	A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea, a lake, or another river.
<b>Precipitation</b>	is rain, snow, sleet, or hail — any kind of weather condition where something's falling from the sky.	<b>Stream</b>	A small, narrow river
<b>Condensation</b>	Water vapour in the air is changed into liquid water.	<b>Sea</b>	An expanse of salt water that covers most of the earth's surface and surrounds its land.
<b>Evaporation</b>	The process of turning from liquid into vapour.	<b>River bed</b>	The water flows over the river bed.
<b>Transpiration</b>	This is the release of water vapor from the leaves of plants into the air.	<b>Source of a river</b>	The original point from which the river flows. It may be a lake, a marsh, a spring or a glacier.
<b>Surface runoff</b>	This can occur when the soil is saturated to full capacity, and rain arrives more quickly than soil can absorb it	<b>Downstream</b>	The direction a stream or river flows.
<b>Groundwater flow</b>	Water that has been absorbed by the ground and then reaches a water source such as a stream	<b>Confluence</b>	The place where two rivers flow together to become one large river.

# Geography




**The United Kingdom is bordered by four seas:**
