Spelling Practice - Adding the suffix **-ous**.

The suffix-ous can just be added to some root words. Mountain - mountain**ous**.

In words ending in **e**, we keep the **e** so that the **g** is a soft **g**. Courage - courage**ous**.

If a root word ends on **our**, we have to **swap** the letters **our** for **or** before adding the suffix **ous**.

Humour - hum**or** - humor + ous

Add the suffix **ous** to these root words.

Outrage, glamour, poison, courage, humour.

Can you put each of these root words + suffix into sentences?
