## Topic Review

In the Autumn term, we studied the teeth of humans and other animals. Rewind your brain and see what you can remember.

1. How many teeth does an adult usually have?
2. Name the four types of teeth?
3. What is the name for an animal that predominantly eats meat?
4. What is the name for an animal that predominantly eats vegetation?
5. What is the name for an animal that eats both meat and vegetation?

### Task

Investigate in your garden or when out for a walk for evidence of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Can you find examples of each type of animal? Draw or take photographs of the creatures you identify or the evidence you find.
