Spelling Practice - Adding the suffix -ly.

To turn adjectives into adverbs, we must check whether there are any letters we have to **swap**, **double** or **drop**. If the root word has more than one syllable and ends in **y**, we have to **swap the y for an i before adding ly**.

For example, bossy becomes bossily.

Change these adjectives into adverbs using the rule. Then, put each of them into a sentence to show you understand their meaning.
